The development of the architectural part of the database (concept and content) and that of the epigraphical component is largely my contribution. Within the framework of this new information system the architectural section has not been conceived as exclusively useable at Sagalassos, but also on other ancient sites, and could, consequently, in the future be distributed as a commercial product to other archaeological projects. Currently executed work includes the testing and correcting of the 'Architectural fragment/*Spolia*' section and the redaction of a manual for the 'Architectural fragment/*Spolia*' section.

The initiative for the *Prosopographia* was taken by Prof. Dr. W. Peremans (1907-1986) and Prof. Dr. E. Van 't Dack (1923-1997), both of the KU Leuven, who directed the project for nearly half a century. The first six volumes (Volume I published in 1950), to which were added Volumes VIII and IX later on, gather all persons for whom an occupation is attested. In addition to this Volume VII contains an index to all persons occurring in Volumes I-VI. On the other hand, Volume X, compiled by C. La'da, collects all ethnics in Ptolemaic Egypt. Since 1981 priority has been given to the computerisation of the documentation in a relational database, intended to be consulted by both Greek papyrologists and Egyptologists (in transcription).
